Fees for Hospital Treatment of Uninsured Residents and Non-Residents of Canada

Yukon Hospital Corporation is obligated to collect fees for medical treatment provided to both uninsured residents and non-residents of Canada. This pamphlet offers a detailed look at who must pay and what the cost of various treatments and procedures are, as determined by the Interprovincial Health Insurance Agreements Coordinating Committee.

for Hospital Treatment of Uninsured Residents and Non-Residents of Canada

Effective April 1, 2020









Who must pay for hospital treatment?

>> Uninsured Residents of Canada

You will be charged the Uninsured Resident rates, which are payable on admission or discharge:

- If you are a Canadian resident without valid provincial or territorial health care coverage.
- If you are a returning Canadian during your waiting period of 3 months for Yukon Health coverage.
- If you are a non-resident of Canada but have proof of valid residency status, including landed immigration papers or permanent residency card, student visa or work visa. This does not include temporary residents.

>> Non-Residents of Canada

You will be charged the Non-Resident rates, which are payable on admission or discharge:

- If you are from out of the country
- If you were unable to provide proof of valid residency status, including landed immigration papers or permanent residency card, student visa or work visa.
- If you are a refugee claimant without valid Interim Federal Health Coverage on the date of service.
- If you are a visiting Canadian and not a permanent resident of Canada. This includes temporary residents.

Fees for Inpatient and Outpatient Hospital Treatment of Uninsured Residents or Non-Residents of Canada

- One or more same day outpatient visits are charged separately.
- Insurance companies are not sent copies of bills for outpatient visits and all charges are payable at time of service.
- Patients who have private insurance are required to provide information to the Finance Department at time of admission. Hospital fees remain the responsibility of the patient.
- Patients should contact their insurer directly.

Inpatient and Outpatient Daily Rate Includes:

Basic diagnostic and hospital stay services.

Charges Not Included in Daily Rate:

- Medical supplies and procedures above normal costs, CT scans, and MRIs.
- Physicians' fees, which are billed separately by the physician's office.
- Ambulance fees, which are billed separately by Yukon Government.
- Medical Evacuation (Medevac) fees, which are billed separately by Yukon Government.

Rates - Whitehorse General Hospital

(All fees are in Canadian dollars)

The following Hospital Rates and U.S. equivalents apply effective April 1, 2020. The US dollar amounts, with the exchange rate of \$1.00 USD = \$1.3257 CAD (or \$1.00 CAD = \$0.7543 USD), are rounded to the nearest dollar. Cheques drawn on a US bank must be in US dollars.
